### November the 5th and all that.

The dreaded (for pet owners) firework season is looming up, so we do not apologise for repeating our annual advice.

Please consider everyone's pets at this time, and how terrified they may be by the noise.

Keep your pets safe inside after dark, or safely on a lead if they have to go out.

Do not fuss them or show anxiety which will only worry them more.

Act normally, with drawn curtains, television or music on, or indoor games to play with them if preferable and they are willing.

If all else fails, allow them a safe place to hide in (eg. behind the sofa, under the stairs, under the bed) and leave them be.

Try to ignore the bangs yourself and make no comment.

You could try using O.A.P. Diffuser, a plug in device giving off appeasing pheromones, which calm the dog.

Alternatively, you can use Bach Flower Remedies, or try the Sounds CD, which helps to get your dog gradually accustomed to all sorts of sounds. Ask at Club about any of these.

### What Do I Buy my Dog for Xmas ?

Well, here's an idea. Honda have recently unveiled their new "dog friendly" car. Called the Honda Dog Friendly Element EX (catchy name – that !!), it features easy-wash seat covers, a fitted cushioned raised dog bed with restraints to keep Fido safe in the event of a crash, a built-in spill-resistant water bowl, an extendable ramp, a rear interior fan and finally, a paw logo on the side of the body (the car, not the dog - stupid !!).

The bad (?) news is that it is only going on sale in the US. Ah well, perhaps next year ..... I think not !!!

As an aside, recent correspondence on a dog rescue website about which car is the best one for dogs, produced the following answer -

***"One in which he can reach the pedals with his paws."*** .....***Boom, Boom !!***

### A Warning about Chocolate

Whilst us humans can eat chocolate with little harmful effect (apart from on the waistline), chocolate contains a chemical called theobromine which is toxic to dogs and is one of the most common forms of dog poisoning in this country. In significant quantities, theobromine can be lethal. Severe symptoms can include vomiting, abdominal pain, panting, drooling, muscle tremors or rigidity

Dark chocolate contains considerably more theobromine than milk chocolate, and cocoa powder contains the highest levels of all (hopefully, the chances of your dog getting hold of a tin of cocoa powder are remote – although it has happened).

In this country, most cases of serious poisoning have related to continental type dark chocolates, as these contain much less milk and more cocoa. As to quantities, well this is very difficult to assess, but, as a rough guide, 4oz of milk chocolate or 1oz of continental dark chocolate could be fatal for a small dog and ½lb of milk chocolate or 2oz of continental dark chocolate could be fatal for a larger sized dog.

If your dog eats any significant quantity of cocoa powder or dark chocolate, **CONTACT A VET IMMEDIATELY. - DO NOT WAIT FOR SYMPTOMS TO BEGIN.**

Chocolate is digested very much more slowly by dogs than people. Symptoms may not appear for many hours after the chocolate is eaten. so do not be fooled into thinking that everything is OK. The earlier the treatment the more likely you are to save your dog's life.

### Winter Weather

During the winter season, bad weather can unfortunately mean that we have to cancel training nights - often at short notice. You will appreciate that in these cases, we cannot ring everyone who might be attending. So, if you have any doubts about the weather, be it snow, ice, thick fog, or flooding, please ring Valerie, or, if she is unavailable, any one of the Officers' numbers (below) to check, and avoid what may be an abortive and uncomfortable journey.
